Critical Failure Criteria

- _____ Failure to take or verbalize body substance isolation precautions.
- _____ Failure to determine scene safety.
- _____ Failure to voice and ultimately provide high concentration oxygen.
- _____ Failure to find or appropriately manage problems associated with airway, breathing, hemorrhage, or shock (hypoperfusion).
- _____ Failure to differentiate patient's immediate need for transportation vs. continued assessment and treatment at the scene.
- _____ Performs other tasks prior to assessing, and treating threats to airway, breathing, and circulation.
- _____ Failure to determine patient's primary problem.
- _____ Orders inappropriate or dangerous interventions.

Must score > 27 to collect 80%, < 27 = Failure.

* Indicates an automatic failure.
